

A MISSING MAN.—On Friday last, a man named James Larrige, who lived on the Lyell road, just out of the city, left home and has not been seen but once since, and that was on the same day toward the evening. He then stated to a man that he was going to Ogdensburgh, but as he had only \$5 in his possession, it is probable that he did not go. He was at that time intoxicated. Larrige was a laborer by occupation, and about 45 years of age. His wife and five children are in great distress at his absence. It is conjectured that he has fallen into the race-way, near the Depot, or he may possibly have been enticed into some hole where he will be kept until his money is gone. Coroner Brown is investigating the case.
