He has a wife and several children.—LARRAGEE is about forty-five years of age, five feet eight inches in height, thick set, dark complexion, and dark hair. He speaks with a husky voice, as though he had a cold. It is said he talked of going to Ogdensburgh when he was seen on Mill street. He had at the time, a five dollar bill. He has been employed as a track hand on the railroad.
